PRESIDENT – Bill Bischoff

For those who tend not to read all the way through, I will lead off with the NATS schedule. The control line racing events will be Monday, July 6 to Thursday, July 9. Monday will be Mouse I, and Vintage B team race. Tuesday will be AMA Slow Rat and combined AMA Goodyear/ Super Sport Goodyear. Wednesday will be Quickie Rat and Sportsman Goodyear. Sportsman Goodyear will have Gold, Silver, and Bronze finals. Thursday will be Super Slow Rat and Clown race.

If you've never attended a NATS, or haven't attended in a while, make this the year. This is the 100th NATS! All your racing buddies would love to see you (again). If you're attending but not flying all the events, considering running an event. It'd sure help me out. All you'll really need to do is run the actual races; I'll do all the preliminary stuff. If you think you might give it a go, just let me know.

I am happy to report that I have secured sponsorship for some of the unofficial events. Chuck Barnes is sponsoring the Gold, Silver, and Bronze awards for Sportsman Goodyear, Richard Kucejko is sponsoring Vintage B Team Race, I am sponsoring Super Sport Goodyear, and Clown Race will be sponsored by the Dallas Model Aircraft Association. Thank you to all of our sponsors. We are still seeking sponsors for Quickie Rat and Super Slow Rat. *I just found out that AMA is giving out medals this year instead of plaques. While the cost of less than \$30 per set of three is attractive, in my opinion, the medals are not. We have been paying about \$100 per set in recent years, and I am currently looking for better deals. I was hoping to order the same awards as AMA was giving out to save some money, but I just can't do it.*

Starting now, we are accepting nominations for NCLRA President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. The current officers have all selflessly volunteered for another term, but nominations are welcome. If nominating someone besides yourself, please get their consent first. FORA Junior .15 NEWS

The NCLRA has only four Fora Junior 15 engines for Sportsman Goodyear available. I don't know when more will be available, so if you want one, you'd better get it now!

These Foras come with 1/8" venturis, whereas all the others that I have seen have venturis with a nominal 4mm bore. We have been conducting most of our tests with a 4mm venturi, and at the 2025 NATS, we told people they could drill their venturis out to 4mm (5/32") diameter if they were smaller. This will be the rule for 2026. I will drill the venturi for you if you request it.

For experimenters, we also have 4 Nelson head buttons available for \$5 each. They will **not** be legal for Sport Goodyear.

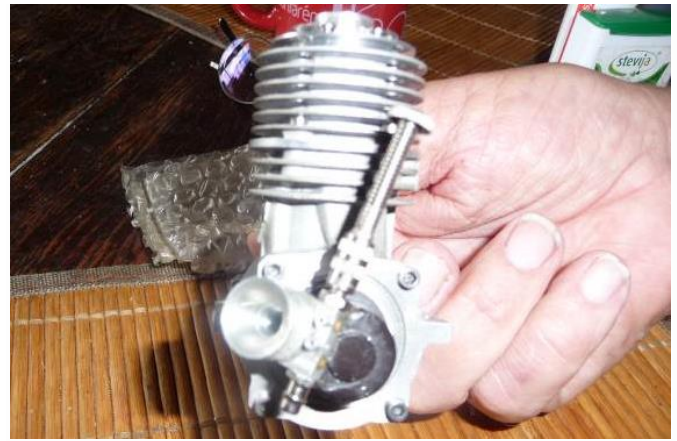

This later version featured an all-steel front end, for increased running stability.

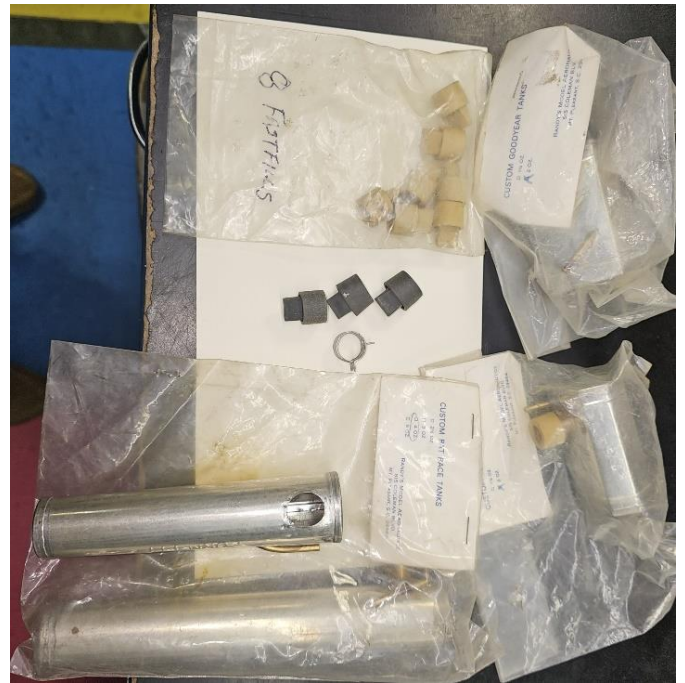


This multi-function valve had more features.



Both standard bush & roller bearing bottom ends.

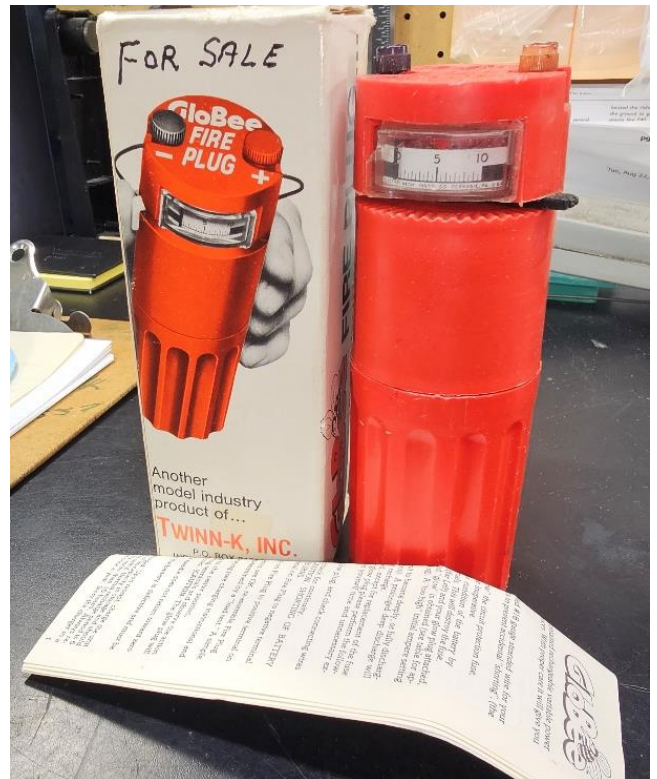

Hello again Bill
I thought I'd touch base with you and show my progress on the new Alley Cat Model.



Along the way I found a couple of areas on the drawing that needed work, so I sent a Rev. "B" of it to Bill Lee. It's taking a little longer than I hoped, but then again, I think I'm getting quite a bit pickier in my workmanship! I've made my carbon gear legs smaller than last year's, and airfoiled them as well, hopefully they'll be robust enough to do the job, I've also added some fairings on the fuselage sides where they

attach and turned some flush mounting hardware so we don't have nuts and bolts hanging out in the breeze. I've also made a carbon sheet horn, and inset it into the elevator, so we don't have the ugly nylon nut plate showing. I'm going to take a little more time on the finish as well, wet sanding the edge between colors and we'll finish with a clear coat that we didn't do on last year's models. This one will get the Fora Jr. engine.

2K AEROSOL CLEAR PAINT

I paint my race planes with Klass Kote two-part epoxy paint. It is durable, chemical proof, and not difficult to spray. My biggest complaint is that the clear isn't truly clear over white. I kept reading on Stunt Hangar about an aerosol clear paint that many of the stunt guys are using, that is supposed to be clear, stay clear, be ultra durable, and spray beautifully from a can. Most commonly, it is referred to as 2K. I have seen this paint under the "Eastwood" brand name and the "Spray Max" brand name, and all indications are that they are the same thing.

In this case, "2K" has nothing to do with the new millenium or number 2000, but means "two komponent" (it's made in Germany). It is a true 2 part catalyzed urethane paint in a spray can. Like the chemical glow sticks we are all familiar with, the can contains an isolated compartment of catalyst within the paint. A button on the bottom of the can is pushed to release the catalyst into the paint, which activates the chemical process that makes the paint cure. Left alone, any unused paint in the can will also cure, but the left-over portion *can* be kept in the freezer and used at a later date.

A word of caution is in order. This paint contains isocyanates, which can kill you if you breathe enough of them. Remember "Imron" paint from back in the day? Yeah, like that. As long as you spray outdoors facing downwind, and wear a good mask, you should be OK. A paper Covid mask WILL NOT be adequate.

Recently, I repainted an airplane with Klasskote. I wanted to wet sand the paint to get rid of the ridges along the color separation lines, and then follow up with a clear coat that was actually clear. I decided to try the 2K clear. I used a left over can of Spray Max 2K that had been in Bill Lee's freezer since last spring, and it worked fine.

Following the typical procedure of a light tack coat first, then a heavier wet coat, it flows and levels beautifully. If you've get good coverage and a smooth finish, leave your plane alone, because you're done. If you absolutely have to polish it afterwards, give it another coat just so you don't end up sanding or buffing through it.

I ended up with some runs and some dry spots on the bottom of the plane, so polishing was in order. First I wet sanded the bad areas with 600 grit, then followed up by wet sanding the entire airframe with 1000 grit. In hindsight, I should have

continued to 1500 or 2000 grit, as some sanding scratches were still visible after polishing.

For the actual polishing, I used a small pneumatic buffer from Harbor Freight, a couple of different textured foam buffing pads, and 3M Perfect-It Rubbing Compound followed by Perfect-It Machine Polish. All the tools and supplies were provided by Bill Lee. Bill courteously tried them all out a year ago on his new Red Miss San Bernardino, so if it went bad on me, it would be my own fault.

I started cautiously with the polish and a smooth texture foam pad, and made almost no progress. The rubbing compound and the egg-crate texture foam pad worked much better at taking the surface to a uniform hazy smoothness, and when some clarity was evident, I switched back to the polish and the smooth foam pad. Frequent wipe downs with a damp paper towel allowed me to monitor my progress. Once I was satisfied, a wash down with glass cleaner and a clean towel left me ready for a coat of regular automobile paste wax.

The whole polishing process was much less delicate and finicky than I had anticipated. In the future, I will be more careful when applying the clear so polishing shouldn't be necessary, but if it is, I'll be up to the task. There is also a similar 2K white paint that I plan to try. I'll let you know how it turns out.

Frank brought us the "Texas Quickie Rat" design and article in a 1986 issue of Model Aviation.





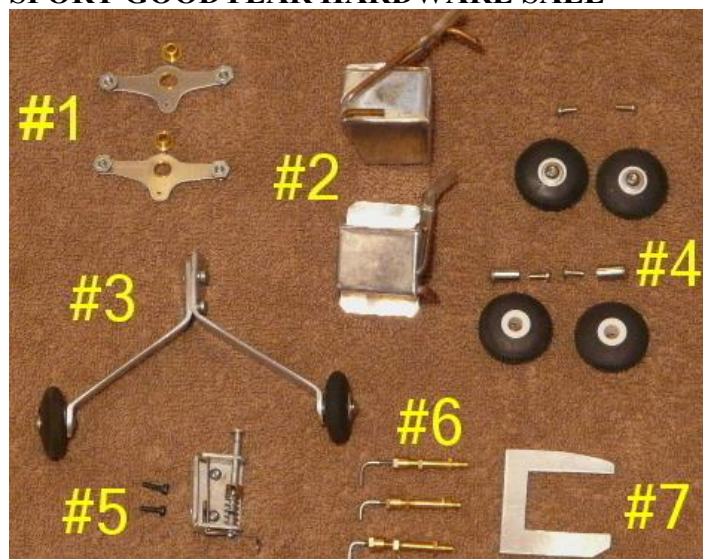
